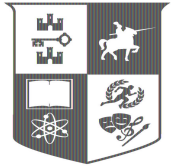

# Health and Safety Updates

- Close Contacts Definition Updated
- Flu vaccinations

- If a student or staff member tests positive for COVID-19, their close contacts will be defined as only those who have been within 6 feet of distance for at least fifteen minutes, while the person was infectious. The infectious period begins two days prior to symptom onset.
- All close contacts should be tested but must self-quarantine for 14 days after the last exposure to the person who tested positive, regardless of that person's test result. The virus can cause illness from 2-14 days after exposure and even asymptomatic individuals can transmit the virus.
  - even if an individual identified as a close contact receives a negative test result, that person must continue to self-quarantine for the full 14 days as the virus may take up to 14 days to cause illness.
- 105 CMR 220.500: Immunization Requirements for Preschool, Elementary, and Secondary School Students
  - new requirement for flu vaccination for all K-12 students starting with the 2020-2021 school year.
  - Documentation of immunization status should be submitted to schools within 60 days of school start
